The eyes are the window to the soul.


Level your eyes and look directly at the camera.

Pro tip: Stack books or a box under your laptop to raise your webcam to eye-level

Let there be light. Lighting is the key to getting a good picture.

Ring lights provide a nice soft image without harsh lighting and shadows.

Avoid backlighting. Don't sit with a bright light source like the sun or lamp behind you.

Use a soft lamp. No need for fancy lighting!

Pro tip: Wearing headphones can reduce echo.


Don't forget about your mobile audience. Don't make your text too small,






Do not wear all black. Webcams don't adjust exposure well.


